Heres how to do it:Secure the cuff around your upper arm.Place your stethoscope over the brachial artery found in the crook of the elbow.Pump the cuff to tighten, listening for when the pulse in the brachial artery stops.Once you hear it stop, stop inflating the cuff.Slowly deflate the cuff, keeping an eye on the sphygmomanometer (blood pressure gauge). Once you hear the pulse again, record the number. This is the systolic blood pressure reading.Continue deflating until the pulse disappears again. Once it does, note and record the sphygmomanometer reading as the diastolic pressure. With practice and professional training, you can learn this technique.
