The role of the chair in meetings is multifaceted, with varying levels of authority depending on the organization. Historically, the term "chairman" emerged as a neutral title to maintain impartiality and ensure objective decision-making. This custom was popularized by Leonard Sachs on British TV shows and later adopted by socialist states as a collective leadership label. The chair's duties include calling meetings to order, recognizing members, and putting questions to vote. While presiding, the chair should remain impartial and avoid interrupting speakers. In committees or small boards, the chair votes alongside other members, whereas in larger assemblies, they only vote when it can impact the outcome. The power of the chair varies greatly across organizations, ranging from executive authority to limited representation. The authority to discipline may rest with whoever appointed or elected the chair, or it may be delegated to other individuals. There are three common types of chairs: executive, non-executive, and lead director. An executive chair typically holds a separate office from the CEO and wields significant influence over company operations. A non-executive chair does not interfere in day-to-day matters and is limited to reviewing board performance and overseeing compliance and audit functions. Many companies have adopted separating the roles of chair and CEO to improve corporate governance. The preferred model varies, with some companies using an executive chair and others employing a non-executive chair. Chairperson roles and responsibilities vary among different organizations and contexts, often involving both formal titles and informal designations. In the absence of a designated chair, groups may elect a temporary chair or designate an acting chair to facilitate decision-making and discussion. In some cases, deputy chairs hold more seniority than vice-chairs due to the presence of multiple vice-chairs but only one deputy chair position. This type of deputy chair typically has an advisory role rather than operational responsibilities, as seen in situations where a deputy chair serves on a corporate board alongside other executives.
