So every time that we wanted to go to the main lodge, which was often, we got soaked since you had to go way around outside in the inclement weather to get into the building. On one of those days, my daughter and 4 children were coming in the front door for lunch and was told to use the back door by some rude staff member at the front desk. They went outside in the rain to the back of the building and of course, the door was locked. So they had to circle back to the front entrance in the rain again. There's no maid service (due to Covid-19; don't know why that is) and you have to go stand in line at the front desk each and every time you needed coffee pods, towels, soap, etc. The rooms are so small and the shower is like a coffin. Even with only 2 people in the room it's hard to move around. Also, the wifi access is sporadic in the room and lodge. But, other than that one rude encounter that my daughter had, the staff was very friendly. And, if the weather is good you have immediate access to the great park.
