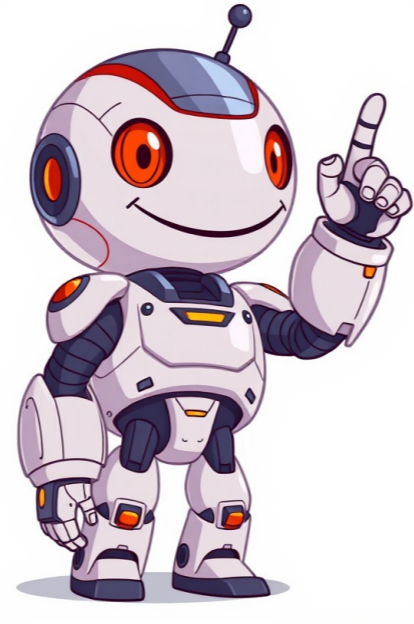

View your connections Tip: If you select a third-party app or service that has a saved password in Google Password Manager, the page displays a link. Manage third-party connections Sign in with Google To use your Google Account to sign in to third-party apps and services, use Sign in with Google. You can sign in across different platforms and browsers without the need to create, save, or remember a new password. Learn more about Sign in with Google. Review & manage these connections Important: If you delete a connection, Google stops automatic sign-in to the app or service. This doesn't delete your data on the third-party app or service. Review your apps and services To review or remove Sign in with Google for an app or service: Go to your Google Account's third-party connections page. Select Sign in with Google Select the third-party app or service whose connection you want to review or remove See details. Tip: If you have more than one connection type with that app or service, your Sign in with Google connection appears under "How Google helps you sign in to {app or service name}." To remove connection, select Stop using Sign in with Google Confirm. Learn how Sign in with Google helps you share data safely. Link your Google Account You can link your Google Account with a third-party app or service to provide improved and personalized experiences. For example, you might link a music streaming service with your Google Account so you can ask Google to play a song from that music streaming service. You won't have access to features that require this connection on any device where you've signed in to your Google Account. Review linked accounts To review or remove Google's access to a third-party app or service: Go to your Google Account's third-party connections page. Select Linked account Select the third-party app or service whose connection you want to review or remove. Tip: If you have more than one connection type with that app or service, this connection appears under "Google has some access to your {app or service name} account." To remove the connection, select the third party. Under "Google has some access to {third-party app or service}." select See details Delete connection Confirm. Tip: Before you delete the connection, to learn about what kind of info the third party shares with Google, read their privacy policy. Share access to your Google Account with a third party Important: Before you give a third-party access to your Google Account, read their privacy policy and security disclosures. From there, you can learn how the third-party app or service uses your data and how they keep it safe. You can allow third-party apps and services some access to your Google Account data. For example, a fitness app might request access to your Google Calendar to display classes you've signed up for through the app. Review & manage these connections Important: If you remove access, the third-party app or service can't access your Google Account. This may make some features unavailable. View your apps and services To review or remove what a third-party app or service can access: Go to your Google Account's third-party connections page. Select Access to your Google Account Select the third-party app or service you want to review. To filter for third-party apps and services with specific access to your Google Account, select Access to Google product or Other account access. Select See details. Tip: If you have more than one connection type with that app or service, this connection appears under "{App or service name} has some access to your Google Account." Review the access that the third-party app or service has to your Google Account. If you want to remove the app or service's access, select Remove access Confirm. Report a third-party app or service If you think a third-party app or service misuses your data: Go to your Google Account's third-party connections page. Select Access to your Google Account Select the third-party app or service you want to review. See details. At the bottom of the page, select Report this app. Fill out the form. Select Submit. We recommend that you get apps from Google Play, but you can also get them from other sources. Your Android device has a security setting (Google Play Protect) that checks for potentially harmful apps, warns you, and removes apps if necessary. Learn how to help protect against harmful apps. Open Google Play. On your device, use the Play Store app . On your computer, go to play.google.com. Find an app you want. To check that the app is reliable, find out what other people say about it. Under the app's title, check the star ratings and the number of downloads. To read individual reviews, scroll to the "Ratings and reviews" section. When you pick an app, tap Install (for no-charge apps) or the app's price. If you find an app that you think is harmful, report it to us. Learn how to report bad apps. Download apps from other sources Important: If you download apps from unknown sources, your device and personal information can be at risk. Your device could get damaged or lose data. Find & open apps Swipe up from the bottom of your screen to the top. If you get All Apps , tap it. Tap the app that you want to open. Tip: If you're using a Google Account for work or school, you'll find your apps in a "Work" tab. From shortcuts Touch and hold the app. If you have options, choose one. Switch between recent apps Swipe up from the bottom, hold, then let go. If you're on Android Go with 3-button navigation, tap Recent apps . Swipe left or right to switch to the app you want to open. Tap the app that you want to open. Close apps Important: Some apps, like Google Play services or system apps, can't be stopped. Learn more about Google Play services. Close one app: Swipe up from the bottom, hold, then let go. Swipe up on the app. Close all apps: Swipe up from the bottom, hold, then let go. Swipe from left to right. On the left, tap Clear all. Close all apps on Android Go: Swipe up from the bottom, hold, and let go. At the bottom, tap Clear all. Find your Home screen: Tap Home or Home. . Tip: Even if you don't close apps, you won't run out of memory or battery. Android manages these automatically. Get new apps You can get more apps in the Play Store app . Learn how to download apps. Related resources Post to the help community Get answers from community members You can get apps, games, and digital content for your device using the Google Play Store app. The Play Store app comes pre-installed on Android devices that support Google Play, and can be downloaded on some Chromebooks. On your device, go to the Apps section. Tap Google Play Store . The app will open and you can search and browse for content to download. If you have issues locating the Play Store app, or opening, loading or downloading content in the app, it could be due to a number of reasons. Some content is available at no charge, and some you need to buy. You can use apps that you bought on Google Play on any Android device without the need to pay again if each device is signed into the same Google Account. To download an app: Open Google Play. On your Android device, open the Google Play app . On your Computer, go to play.google.com. Search or browse for an app or content. Select an item. Select Install (for no charge items) or the item's price. Tips: To check that an app is reliable, find out what other people say about it. [Play Apps][Video]How to get Android apps using the Play Store app On your device, open the Google Play Store or go to play.google.com on a web browser. Search or browse for content. Select an item. Select Install or the item's price. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the transaction and get the content. If you made a purchase before: Select your payment method with the Down arrow . If it's your first purchase: Your payment method will be added to your Google Account. Tip: To change your display language on Google Play, change the language in your Google Account settings. Find apps for your watch, tablet, TV, car, or other device You can use Play store filters to search or browse apps and games that are compatible with each of your devices. On your phone: Open the Google Play app . At the top, search for an app or content. In the dropdown menu, choose a device associated with your account. On your computer: Go to play.google.com. At the top right, click the magnifying glass . Then, search for an app or content. Select the device dropdown and choose a device associated with your account. After you follow these steps, in your search results, you'll find the apps that are compatible with your device. Tip: To use the search filter, you must be signed in to an account associated with multiple Android devices. Apps and digital content are connected to your Google Account, not just your device. You don't have to buy them again if you get a new device. You can use them on multiple devices. Learn how to install apps and content from your phone or computer to other devices. Content can't be transferred between accounts if you own multiple accounts, you can't transfer content between accounts on Google Play. If you have multiple accounts on your device, before you complete your purchase, make sure you're signed in to the account you want to use. If you purchased an app on the wrong account, contact the app developer. They may give you a refund for your purchase. Post to the help community Get answers from community members You can find apps, extensions, and browser themes for the Google Chrome browser in the Chrome Web Store. With these additions, you can do more with Chrome. Get more done with apps for Chrome You can use apps to create documents, edit photos, play games, listen to music, and more. There are two types of apps: Apps that work like regular websites (For example, Gmail). Apps that work like software programs on your desktop, relying on certain features of Chrome (For example, Google Keep). Here are some benefits of using apps: Apps install quickly, without restarting your computer or browser. Your apps are always available when you sync apps across multiple computers. Apps are always up-to-date because they are hosted on the web. Apps won't crash your computer. If you have trouble with an app, close its tab. You can easily find and open the app using app launcher. Make webpages more useful with extensions Add extensions to Google Chrome to make the webpages you visit more useful to you. Here are a few benefits of using extensions: You can use them to add new features to existing web apps. You get relevant links and information on pages. You get timely notifications about certain events. You can use them as shortcuts when they appear on your address bar. Personalize Chrome with browser themes You can personalize your Google Chrome browser by changing how it looks. Watch videos to learn about Chrome Web Store Chrome Web Store availability You can install items at no charge from the Chrome Web Store. To pay for apps, extensions or browser themes, you need a Google Payments account. Check if Google Payments is available in your country. The Chrome Web Store will show available items based on your Chrome browser language and location. To see featured content and paid items in local currency, click Settings . Click your language and country. You can update your Android apps one at a time, all together, or automatically. At the top right, tap the profile icon. Tap Manage apps & device. Under "Updates available," tap See details. Next to the app you want to update, tap Update. To update all your apps at the same time, tap Update all. Tips: When some apps get updated, they require new permissions. You may get a notification that asks whether you accept the new permissions. To update an app, you may need to restart your device. If the app has an update available, the "Update" button appears on the app's "Details" page. Update Android apps automatically Update all of your Android apps automatically Open the Google Play app . At the top right, tap your Profile picture. Tap Settings Network Preferences Auto-update apps. Select an option: Tip: If an account on your device has a sign-in error, apps may not update automatically. Update individual Android apps automatically Open the Google Play app . At the top right, tap your Profile picture. Tap Manage apps & device Manage. Find the app you want to update automatically. To open the app's "Details" page, tap the app. On the app's "Details" page, tap More . Turn on Enable auto update. When updates are available, the app updates automatically. To turn off automatic updates, turn off Enable auto update. Tips: When some apps get updated, they require new permissions. You may get a notification that asks whether you accept the new permissions. To update an app, you may need to restart your device. If the app has an update available, the "Update" button appears on the app's "Details" page. Important: This option is available to a limited group. Open the Play Store app . At the top right, tap the profile icon. Tap Settings Network preferences Auto-update apps. Tap Update with limited amount of mobile data. How it works Google Play can use a limited portion of your monthly mobile data to automatically update your apps. Google Play prioritizes app updates using several factors, like apps with new features or apps we think you'll use the most. Google Play always tries to update apps over Wi-Fi first. How much mobile data this setting uses When this setting is on, Google Play picks a budget based on several factors. For example: If you update apps manually over mobile data in the last 30 days, Google Play uses that total amount of mobile data as the budget. If you don't update apps over mobile data, Google Play uses the average amount of mobile data most people use in your country/region that still allows you to auto-update your most frequently used apps. All information is used in accordance with Google's Privacy Policy. If you clear Play Store data, your settings and previous budget will be reset.
